My dear brothers and sisters,

Of course, the month of May marks our last weeks of worshiping in our beautiful Liberty Hill sanctuary. Lakeside worship will resume on the first Sunday in June and continue there at least until the first Sunday

I was curious about the opportunity so my wife and I came up here and met with the committee in charge and we decided that this was indeed the leading of the Lord, so the first Sunday of June arrived and so did the Leiningers with plans to stay the summer. HA!

Summer turned to winter and then came another spring and summer. That was followed by another. And then another. By the time 1984 had arrived, I was feeling that my continued presence here was no longer of the same value and I mentioned that to a friend of mine with whom I was associated in a Clinical Pastoral Education program. I was feeling it was time to move, but I did not want to leave Liberty Hill in the lurch as summer was quickly approaching. He said to me, "I would love to serve a church like that." Really? OK. He was invited up to preach and meet with the Session. They came to an agreement, so my last Sunday here was the final Sunday in May. That was his first Sunday. His name was Dr. Gene Rollins, and as many of you know, his time here extended over the next 27 years.

Our worship pavilion at 52 Nautical Drive, Camden, is a magnificent facility and a pleasure to encourage worship as we enjoy God's goodness in nature. As is also our regular practice these days, those services will begin an hour earlier than we have been used to, 9:00 AM. Meanwhile, we retain our regular schedule through the month of May. See you at worship on the hill, Sunday morning at 10:00 AM. Stay safe and take care of one another.
