As was his custom, the author wrote this hymn to accompany his sermon on 1 Chronicles 17:16–17, preached on January 1, 1773; he called it “Faith’s Review and Expectation.” Much of its current popularity comes from this now-familiar tune, an association that began in 1835.

The Lakeside interdenominational worship ministry began on a Sunday morning in July 1977 with 12 attendees in the Deal's Marina parking lot on Lake Wateree, sponsored by Liberty Hill Presbyterian Church. In the nearly 5 decades since, this community ministry has attracted scores of worshippers from numerous local churches each Sunday from June through September. In a sanctuary made by God's own hand, this welcoming service outside the walls of a conventional church building provides an opportunity for fellowship in which the presence of God can be known. In 1995, LHPC's leadership, under the direction of pastor Gene Rollins, dreamt of **Wateree Lake Ministries** becoming its own 501(c) (3) with its own lakeside property on which to hold worship services. This vision became a reality in 2004, when two lots were donated for this purpose for the glory of God. In true interdenominational spirit, the grounds hold elements from different denominations, such as Stations of the Cross and a walking prayer labyrinth, in addition to the mounted wall cross and standing Yard cross. These grounds were dedicated debt-free for community use and to the glory of our most high God.
